
PLANNED OPS & PROCEDURES - KOUDA

- Sign-up sheets and Band Place Cards
- * BANDS are:
 - > 80, 40, 20, 15, 10, 6 & 2 meters
- MODES are:
 - > SSB, CW, &Digital (PSK & RTTY)
- To operate, <u>sign up</u> and <u>take a Place Card</u> for the Band and MODE
- * 1-hour time limit; everyone gets a chance!

OPERATIONS PLAN - KOUDA

- Improve the club bonus point capture
- * Improve the club understanding of close station interference
- Encourage operators to get experience on bands they normally can't operate

COMPUTER LOGGING - WU6X

- If you bring your own laptop, Dennis will install Field Day logging software
 Software provides central log on the server
- All stations can see what others are doing
- System notes / alerts

PUBLICITY, BONUS POINTS - WF6J

- Media Publicity = 100 pts
- Public Location = 100pts
- Public Info Table = 100pts
- Emergency Power ONLY
 - 4A class = 400 pts
- Send a message to the ARRL Section Mgr = 100pts
- Satellite QSO = 100 pts
- 5 contacts Alternate Power
 (batt or solar) = 100 pts

Site Visit = 100 pts

- GOTA Coach points times 2
- Maximum Power, 150 Watts doubles QSO points
- Youth bonus (18 or under) =
 20 points up to 100 points
 - Copy W1AW Bulletin = 100pts
 - Educational activity = 100pts
 - Submit via Web = 50 points

GET ON THE AIR (GOTA) - WF6J

- Logging via Laptop (automatic dupe check)
- Keep track of "operators" manually
 - > Youth Bonus (18 or younger), 1 QSO = 20 points
 - > 20 QSO = 20 bonus points; 20 more = +20 points
- GOTA Coach doubles the score (can't log)
- Callsign (TBD) used for the entire event
