# The NCDXF App for Android

The Northern California DX Foundation (http://ncdxf.org/) promotes DX operation all over the world by providing assistance to DXpeditions, educating operators, and supporting a number of beacon stations on five HF bands. The NCDXF app for Android provides a visual display of the beacon locations on a world map to make it easy to see which beacon is currently transmitting, which ones are currently offline, and which stations will soon be transmitting again.

#### The Beacons

There are currently 18 beacon locations world-wide. They all transmit on the same frequency on each band, but at different times in a round-robin fashion. Each station identifies itself in code, but at 22WPM, so even many hams who know code may not be able to easily copy their call off the air.

Also, I've found that when I'm at my station, there's just enough time in the cycle between the beacons going around the world for me to get distracted and start fiddling with something else in front of me while I'm waiting to hear a beacon come in on the receiver. Then, after two or three beacons have gone by, I realize I haven't been listening to see which ones they were. There are 18 beacon locations (currently) around the world.

The beacons and their frequencies are:

10m: 28.200 MHz 12m: 24.930 MHz 15m: 21.150 MHz 17m: 18.110 MHz 20m: 14.100 MHz

At any given time, one or two of the beacons will be off the air. Sometimes they'll also be using a fill-in antenna that has a directional pattern until the omnidirectional antenna is back in commission.

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#### The App

With the NCDXF app, you can just look at the screen to see which station is marked as transmitting right now, and, once you know the order, know which ones were recently on the air (fig.1). Finding out which stations you can hear, and which you can't, will give you a quick read on current other operators in that part of the world.





Fig. 2-The NCDXF Band Selection Menu

There is a menu to set which band you are monitoring in the app (fig. 2). The display of each station on each band's map shows if that station is operational or not, and whether it is operating in an unusual fashion (e.g. a directional antenna.)

The NCDXF app is free on the Google Play Store. Unfortunately, it is not available on the Amazon Appstore for devices that don't have access to the Play Store. Similar apps are available for iOS at the Apple App Store. They are HF Beacons and BeaconAid-HF, at 99 cents apiece.

The app has been a useful little thing for me to have. It makes it so that I've got something to let me know how long until the beacons I can expect to hear will be coming on, and it gives me something to watch to keep from getting too distracted before I hear them.

The California QSO Party (CQP) is now behind us, but the memory of my portable operation from a campground in Siskiyou County remains as a pleasant reminder of how much fun you can have while portable. Siskiyou County turned out to be a "rare one" as there was only one other call registered for the event in the county ... I never heard them on. Most of the 315 casual contacts I made thanked me for a "new one".

I operated my Elecraft KX3 on 40m exclusively on battery power, CW and SSB, from a 40m resonant inverted-V attached to a 1:1 voltage balun and fed with 75 feet of RG8X. The apex was supported about 60 feet up by a limb in a fir tree with legs about 30 feet off the ground. That lofty perch was "fished" with a stout fishing rod and 2-oz. sinker attached to 20 pound line used to pull the antenna guy rope up and back down to the balun for hoisting. This has been a very effective method for getting a line over a limb, high in a tree and proved successful for Field Day this year as well.

In any case, if you've never operated during CQP I highly recommended it. The "event" is not really a "contest", but can be a lot of fun trying to catch all the counties in California. Operation is casual and friendly with an easy exchange of consecutive number and county abbreviation (maybe some fishing or hiking in between?). I hope to hear you on next year ... I'll be portable again, probably from a campground somewhere in Siskiyou County.
