It's getting close to Field Day again. It seems like it's creeped up on us quickly this year. At this point, it seems we're just beginning to plan for the event. While many of us have been doing Field Day with SFARC for many years and have "seen it all," remember we have new amateurs who have never experienced the fun and excitement of setup day, the great food, the fun of operating anywhere on the band regardless of license class, and our world famous breakfast of champions.

If you've never done it before, you owe it to yourself and the club to haul your butt up to Nyack and check it out. If you're an old timer, you owe it to the next generation of ham radio operators to show them the ways of the RF Jedi. Field Day is the 4th Saturday and Sunday of June. Plan on making it a campout if you can. We're planning some fun activities for you and your families. A sneak peek is the club sponsored dinner on Saturday night, just bring a side to share.

As we enter a solar low point for the next few years, band conditions will steadily decline and using the spectrum will become increasing challenging. In these conditions, the most efficient way of getting the message through is going to be digital modes. We're considering changing things up a bit for this year. Come closer, I'll explain. What if we decided to place both CW/Data stations alongside SSB on each band? How can we do that you ask? If we change our classification to QRP on battery power, bring in the big gun antenna systems and concentrate on how to get your signal out as opposed to splattering each other with RF for 24 hours, we can build one big operating tent, setup stations alongside each other so we can all play together. Each SSB contact would be multiplied by 4 and CW/data by 6. We won't have to have big generators running all day and night; we'll learn how to maximize our signals and overcome poor conditions. These sound like great skills going into a solar low and even better skills once great propagation returns in a few years.

We are looking for members to fill some positions on the Field Day committee also, all of the big scary positions have been filled. Please come to the next meeting on 4-5-2016 at from 5:30-7 at the Newcastle Denny's. If you can make it for all or part of the meeting we look forward to seeing you there.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED 2016

The club is rapidly acquiring a reputation for providing dependable communications support for charity events. We've been supporting the MS walks from at least 2002 which was my first one. We've now done four Cystic Fibrosis bike rides in the Newcastle area and now we are being asked to support our fourth Tour de Cure Diabetes bike ride in Rocklin. We are also asked to support the California Enduro Riders Association events which take place in the Eldorado National Forest near Georgetown. These are usually in the spring and in the fall and are an all day event in the woods. Everyone who has done them says they are great fun and a tremendous learning experience. The Club has supported this event since before 2002.

Consequently I am asking for volunteers for the following events:

Sunday April 24, 2016 -- MS Walk in Folsom -- starts about 0700 and is done by 1030

Sunday May 1, 2016 -- Enduro near Georgetown from 0700 until about 1500

Saturday May 21, 2016 -- Tour de Cure (Diabetes) -- Rocklin -- starts 0630 and ends by 1700

Saturday October 8, 2016 — Cystic Fibrosis bike ride – Newcastle area — starts about 0700 and is over by 1300

The end times shown for each event are for the last station to be closed. As the events progress, we are able to release the stations as the last walker/riders pass by. In other words if you are manning the first rest stop then you will most likely be the first released. Also the report times are varied depending on the estimated time that the station would be manned. So this means that the total event time does not apply to all volunteers.

We provide radio support for the start/finish line, each rest stop, and the SAG wagons-the mobile vans that patrol the routes and assist riders in need. In the past we have found that it is best to have two people at each station-including the SAG wagons. The second person does not have to be a HAM, but it helps.

Each operator needs to supply the radio equipment for the station assigned. For the SAGs this means usually a dual band HT and a mag mount antenna.

This is a perfect opportunity to use your radio for more than checking into the Thursday night and Sunday night nets. I highly recommend that each new HAM volunteer for at least one event. You would be paired with an experienced person who will show you the "ropes" about volunteering. New hams do not need to carry a radio with them.

Course Description: Disasters strike daily all over the globe. California is no exception. Communications are critical in an emergency, but what if they fail? HAM CRAM is a no code AMATEUR RADIO TECHNICIAN LICENSE cram course. This course will review the FCC Technician license exam questions and help keep you talking when disaster hits. The FCC exam will be provided the day of the course between 5:00 pm and 6:00 pm. To take the FCC exam students must bring with them an identification such as a government issued photo ID, a drivers license, passport, military ID, etc.

Prerequisites/Study Material: Instructions will be provided and sent to you via e-mail upon registration. Please provide a **valid e-mail address upon registration** so the material can be sent to you.

Registration/Cancellation: No walk-ins allowed. You must be pre-registered for the course no later than May 10. Space is VERY limited, so contact the SRMC Education Department at 916-781-1278 or e-mail Soraya Shadwick at shadwism@sutterhealth.org. Cancellations should be received at least 72-hours prior to the course if possible. Lunch is available at the cafeteria next to the class room.

Course Fees: There is no fee for the course itself. However you must bring a \$15.00 check payable to "ARRL VEC" for the test fee if you are taking the FCC test after the class. No cash or credit cards.
