Need a Winter Project? Submitted by Dennis, WU6X


Are you looking for a winter project that produces a very cool tool for your ham shack, or for portable CW operations? You might want to consider the *Ultra Pico Keyer* (UPK) by Ham Gadgets. The UPK is a 4-memory programmable, battery-powered, Morse Code, auto-keyer with speed control. Some of you may have noticed mine in use at Field Day last year, connected to my KX3? Programming is easy and includes "special codes" for repeating characters, pausing for input (like a sequential QSO number), and other automatic functions.



The UPK output provides a short to ground (60v max) which works nicely with any radio not having a built-in keyer, or with newer radios when connected to the key connector (set menu set to straight key, if applicable). A built-in speaker provides sound for programming the unit with a CW paddle, or listening to the programmed memory while in operation. memories are accessed with four individual memory buttons.

This is truly a fun project to build. Ham Gadgets has sold thousands as the kit makes an excellent project for new hams or old hams with too much winter time on their hands. Build time is about a 1/2 hour, with excellent pictorial instructions. The unit is powered by a CR232 Lithium coin cell. The UPK is priced at just under \$30 and includes the case.
