# Action packed start to 2020!

## Repeaters

W6EK 440.575 +5 is a bee hive of activity with the recent activation of the Yaesu DR2-XR Fusion repeater with Wires-X node 52998 and often connected to the YouTubers room. The 70-cm Fusion repeater is also linked with the K6IOK 147.36 +.6 Fusion repeater in Rocklin, which provides excellent 2 meter coverage throughout the Sacramento Valley. It has been fun to ride along and stay in touch with local hams during their trips to Quartzsite, AZ. A BIG thanks to Scott, KK7AIR for the Yaesu equipment loan to the club and especially to Clyde, AB4CC for installing and continuing to add more and more features! I recently overheard a QSO that stated the obvious, "sure is good to hear all of the activity on the 440 pair raised from the dead!"

Craig, KM6LYW and Clyde have installed an AllStarLink Node on the W6EK 145.43 -.6 PL162.2 repeater and removed IRLP. AllStarLink is based on the Asterisk open source communications project and provides an excellent audio quality with minimal latency. Inbound and outbound connections to other AllStarLink repeaters and personal nodes can be made on the W6EK AllStarLink node 51018. Echolink has been moved to this system and the service now supports both inbound and outbound connections via Echolink node 4128. Repeater etiquette reminder: Before connecting to another node, be sure to announce on the W6EK repeater where you will be connecting and disconnect when you are done.

Rich and Bob will lead in setting up and breaking down the PA, lighting and projection systems at each club meeting. I am certain that they would appreciate your assistance if you are able to arrive a few minutes early and stay a few minutes afterwards!

# Winter Field Day

A successful and fun Winter Field Day was hosted January 24-26 at the Georgetown, CA Airport campground. Operation at this beautiful location was made possible by Scott, KK7AIR through his contacts with El Dorado County. Scott also provided access road improvements and spent many hours with his team, "Ranch Hand" Jeff and Gary, KN6AVC prepping the area. Eighteen members and guests made quick work of both camp set-up and break-down. This included a large tarp with the social, operation and cooking canopies underneath, two 80-10m doublets, 160-10m inverted L endfed, hexbeam, 6m-1.2GHz yagi, 2m/70cm dipoles along with four HF and VHF/UHF stations.

Bruce, K6BAA demonstrated his recently completed portable dual axis tracker with 2/440m Arrow antenna, which he used to successfully log a 1500 point satellite exchange for WFD. Congrats Bruce for pulling off a rare satellite contact in tough and crowded contest conditions! You have got to see this automatic tracking rig in action! Hoping that we will see it again at the ARRL Summer Field Day?

Over the 2 ½ days we hosted 80 daily visits. Breaking this down, there were 51 unique attendees made up of 28 members and 23 guests and visitors! 17 members and guests operated stations and approximately 14 assisted with logging. Scott and Al, N6ADT both offered rides in their planes. The social tent and campfire were popular hang-outs from early morning until... well... the early morning hours! The potluck, pizza party, free breakfasts and the group sharing snacks table were delicious and much appreciated! A 1/2" of rainfall hit camp at 10pm Saturday night before wrapping up around 11am on Sunday. No radio gear got wet, but the canopies and tarps needed attention before storing away. A big thank you to the Village Center in Meadow Vista for allowing us to use the vacant library space to dryout the gear!

Scores? Orion, AI6US, event co-chair reports that we made 281 contacts with 16 multipliers. The exchanges came from 90 CW, 268 Phone and 23 digital QSOs on 160 – 70cm. Our claimed score is 21,808, an impressive increase despite poor band conditions over last year's score of 13,632! An event overview and scoring break-down will be presented at the next club meeting on February 14<sup>th</sup>.

Many WFD event photos have been uploaded on the <u>Groups.io SFARC forum</u> and an awesome video created by Mike, KK6GLP is on the <u>SFARC Youtube channel</u>. It took a big team of volunteers to make our Winter Field Day event happen and far too many to list, but I do want to especially thank one member Jim, WA8MPA for his equipment donations, hard work and leadership that he puts into our events. Please join me in thanking everyone who pitched in to make WFD such a huge success!

# Yaesu FTM 400XDR, Kantronice KPC 3+ nad WinLink

For the holidays I bought myself Yaesu FTM 400 XDR and a Kantronics KPC 3+ USB, in addition I also bought a Yaesu CT-167 Data Cable to connect the two.

The first step is to make the cable between the FTM \$\$ and the KPC. The KPC 3+ includes a DB-9 connector. Only 4 wires need to be soldered to the DB-9.

The connector is soldered as followers: Brown wire to Pin 1 Red wire to Pin 3 Yellow wire to Pin 5 Ground (Shield) to Pin 6

Once the soldering is done connect the cable between the FTM 400 Data Port and the DB-9 connector on the KPC 3+.

Now it is time to set up the FTM 400 for doing data. The directions can be found starting on page 164 of the FTM 400 Operating Manual.

In step 6 of the directions chose the default of 9600


In steps 7 and 8 for the Data Band Select I chose B-BAND FIX so I could do data on VFO B while keeping VFO A on Fusion set to the club's repeater.

In step 12 Data Speed I chose the default of 1200

That is all that is needed for the configuration of the FTM 400.

The WinLink settings should be set as shown, chose the Serial Port that is correct for your system.

In Windows 10 use the Device Manager to find the correct COM Port. The Port will be listed under the "Ports (COM & LPT) entry that says "USB Serial Port." In my case it was COM12. The WinLink settings should look like (with the exception of the Serial Port):
