October Power Supply Build


Twelve members met up at the Granite Bay Library to assemble power supply circuits. We are happy to report that nobody was injured with a soldering iron nor was there any purple smoke when power was applied.



In spite of documentation discrepancies and missing components (who put the kits together?) Jon Nall, Al6W, was able to assemble and power up his unit in record time!


Doug Chandler, W2VX, provided instruction to those needing refresher on color codes, identifying Pin 1 on DIP devices, identifying which end of the diode is the Cathode, looking up transistor pinouts, etc. Experience builders were great mentors. One example was organizing the parts to match the BOM. Given Smitty, WB1G, was unavailable to provide instruction on soldering Jon Kim, KI6RT, stepped in as the substitute

instructor. Instructions included 1) do not touch "business end" or the iron to one's forehead, 2) clean the soldering iron tip and "wet it" with solder, 3) apply heat to the pad & the component lead, 4) apply solder (not too little, not too right), etc. Perhaps a future build lab should include soldering:











Shown in the picture is a Single Output Power Supply packaged in the chassis supplied for the build outputting 13.8V DC at 3.75 Amps (note Doug is using an adequate heatsink to deliver this power level otherwise one should expect purple smoke!).

This configuration is limited to 2-3 Amps at 12-14 volts. Limitations on power are a function of the capacity of the AC/DC module, pass transistors and of course thermal management (i.e. heat sinks). Jon Kim, KI6RT, showed the group a 10 Amp version of the Single Output Power Supply for those interested in a higher current version.

What's Next?

Those who have not completed the project should attend the RDF/Technology Zoom (2nd & 4th Wednesday at 7:30PM) where Doug, Greydon & Jon will continue to answer questions and help participants complete their builds.

Once a critical mass of builds are working, we will work through adjusting Current Limit and adding the OVP (Over Voltage Protection).

Given the design flexibility we will consult on how what is an appropriate output Current given the AC/DC design used (module or transformer supplied with the kits are limited to 40 VA – yeah you need to do the math), pass transistors & heatsink, chassis options, etc.

Finally

Some were not able to make the build due to calendar conflicts (wouldn't a club calendar be nice?). Those who have paid can pickup their kits at the next club meeting – Nov 11 at Crossroads Church. All others contact Jon Kim, KI6RT, to arrange logistics (will ship using USPS Flat Rate Box – this time only) or pickup at a club event.
