## Meeting Notes

### 1. Review and Approval of Previous Minutes

The minutes from the previous meeting were reviewed. No changes were required, and the minutes were accepted as official record.

### 2. Financial Updates

There was ongoing discussion about reconciling the club table and scholarship fund balances from the HamFest event. The following figures were referenced:

- Club funds: \$1,170 initially reported; with an additional \$730 pending deposit (including \$230 cash on hand, ~\$400 in equipment pending pickup, and minor amounts from other members), totaling \$1,800.
- Scholarship fund: \$4,995 initially reported, revised to \$4,795 after adjustments.
- Resolution: Frank will resubmit the official spreadsheet with Lori's numbers. The finalized figures will be sent to Laurie, Rod, and Jim for closure and then forwarded to the board for final review. Communication to the organization will likely occur via the next newsletter.

### 3. Equipment/Field Day Preparations

Smitty provided an update on equipment for Field Day:

- Thanks to Tom (NN6H) for running the GOTA table and lending his radio.
- Only notable gap is with the mobile radio satellite workstation and confirmation on the spider beam (Derek to be followed up with).

- All other essential antennas and radios are accounted for, including, L Wire Yagi 40M (club asset), 15/10/20 Yagi (club asset), and 2m/6m/70cm vertical (to be brought by Smitty), and the crank up tower and Yagi for the CW station (brought by Bob).
- Discussion about the VHF/UHF station and the potential value of including a six-meter station this year is ongoing.
- Generator for the event is confirmed (Scott's equipment).
- Suggestion made to defer decision on six-meter station.
- Next planning meeting will be on the 14th.

#### 4. Public Information & Outreach (PIO). Updates given by Smitty WB1G:

- Flyer and media release have been distributed to ARRL members, Gold Country Media, K-Max TV, and HRO (where flyers are on display and printed on receipts).
- T-shirt design finalized, featuring an American flag. Sales to start around May 15th, but shirts are already available online.
- Field Day is being aggressively marketed; PIO has been more manageable this year, aided by the date change of the Hot RF Nights event.
- Trifolds and club promo cards are stocked (approx. 500 trifolds with Smitty) plus 25 to 30 with Brian will be distributed to members for handouts.
- Field Day pins (GOTA and ARRL pins) are available for volunteers and participants; the tradition of club purchasing these for awards continues and individual members can purchase them on their own.

#### 5. Scholarship Program Update

Earl K6GPB provided a scholarship program update:

- Three candidates recommended for \$1,000 scholarships each:
  - Haley Green - Pre-med, Forest Hill High School
  - Angel Jarawa - Industrial Engineering, Placer High School
  - Logan Abbott - Engineering, Colfax High School
- The board supported the committee's recommendations and will proceed with awarding the scholarships.
- Scholarships will remain consistent at \$1,000 each despite available funds, to ensure stable offerings year-to-year.
- The application window has closed as of April 30. The website will be updated to reflect this.
- Letters of acceptance and non-selection to be drafted and sent by the committee, with check preparation to follow.
- There is a time constraint for notifying the Placer Union School District (school scholarship events taking place next week), so timely communication is crucial.

## 6. General Officer & Director Updates

- Presentation for the upcoming general meeting; finalized slide deck circulated.
- Food closet update:
  - Current needs: Jellies, paper towels, toilet paper, Kleenex
  - Peanut butter supply is sufficient; these donations support children's lunches.
- Touch & Take It event: Second round scheduled, with equipment giveaways and some items for sale (to be separated from free items).

## 7. Membership Report

April activity:

- 5 new memberships
- 7 class enrollments
- 1 repeater donation (\$10)
- Laurie to email details to Mark for inclusion in the update slides.

## Meeting Minutes

### 1. Logistics and Safety Information

The meeting opened with standard logistics and safety details provided:

- Restroom locations were described.
- In case of emergency, attendees should gather in the parking lot across the street, and the sign-in list will be used for roll call.

### 2. New Members, Visitors, and Club Updates

- First-time visitors and new members were acknowledged.
- The club offers monthly introductory classes and license testing (first Monday of each month); all are invited to participate.
- Last month's minutes were approved without amendments.
- The club currently has 343 members in the system. Members are requested to update their contact information in Ham Club Online and not use ARRL aliases, as they are not supported.

### 3. Scholarship and Discount Program Announcements

- The organization has become one of only 10 non-university BE teams administering the "Teen and Young Adult Scholarship Program."
- This initiative provides free exams and the first FCC license for individuals aged 25 or younger.
- The first recipient is Claire Hunter (KO6NOH), received her license this week.
- Club is now offering a **\*\*50% discount on all exams\*\*** for active/past military and first responders; in the past two weeks, two military personnel and one EMS member benefited.
- Bob has joined as a new VE, and Kerry has joined as an Elmer.

### 4. Fundraising and Club Event Announcements

- Sales of donated equipment reported a profit of almost \$5,000 at HamFest, which will support the scholarship program.
- "Donuts in the Park" event will be held on Saturday, starting at 9:00 AM; setup starts around 7:30 AM.\*\*
- Attendees are encouraged to bring chairs, and supplies for sun and mosquitoes.

## 5. Field Day Event Preparations (June 27–28, 2024)

- Field Day runs June 27th through 28th, 2026.
- Volunteers needed for “bandmasters” to optimize radio operations; 24-hour event needing several volunteers.
- Setup will begin Friday at 8:30–9:00 AM with a pre-event and safety brief for all volunteers.
- Bob will provide a demonstration of safety equipment.
- Last year, there was a medical emergency; volunteers were praised for health and safety vigilance.
- Spaces for tents/trailers are available for participants wishing to stay overnight.

## 6. GOTA (Get on the Air) Operations and Points

- GOTA operators (first-year amateurs) earn extra points; Maxim and others were encouraged to participate for bonus points (2x or 3x standard points).
- Tom (NN6H) is leading the GOTA station.

## 7. Meals and Merchandise

- Food will be provided for the event: tri-tip and chicken for dinner, pizza for the setup night, and breakfast.
- Field Day T-shirts are available online, celebrating the 250th anniversary of the United States.
- Shirts come in three styles (women’s version, men’s premium & standard), costing about \$4–\$5 difference.

## 8. Aries and Equipment Donations

- Aries is working on new field operation guides and net control process.
- Brian received donated radio equipment (Kinley TMG7F7, Diamond X50 antenna, Astron 20A power supply) for new licensees, courtesy of Placer County ARES.

## 9. LiFePO4 Battery Education Session

- Greg (KO6TH) presented a workshop on lithium iron phosphate (LFP) batteries, covering do’s and don’ts, correct charging procedures, and key technical differences replace lead-acid batteries. The video will be available on the YouTube channel.

## Next Steps

1. Update your contact information in Ham Club Online, using a real email—not an ARRL alias.
2. Military and first responders: register for exams with your service information to receive discounted rates.

3. Participate in “Donuts in the Park” at 9:00 AM on Saturday; remember to bring chairs and weather protection.
4. Volunteer as a bandmaster or set-up crew for Field Day (June 26–28); arrive by 8:30–9:00 AM for pre-brief.
5. Order your Field Day T-shirt via the provided link; three versions available.
6. New licensees in need should contact Brian for donated equipment.
7. Review Greg's presentation slides on LiFePO4 batteries for further details and best practices.
