## WHO/WHAT

Members of the Sierra Foothills Amateur Radio Club will be participating in the national ARRL Amateur "Ham" Radio Field Day exercise, June 22 – 23 at Georgetown Airport. Hams from across North America ordinarily participate in Field Day by establishing temporary ham radio stations in public locations to demonstrate their skill and service. Their use of radio signals, which reach beyond borders, bring people together while providing essential communication in the service of communities. Field Day highlights ham radio's ability to work reliably under any conditions from almost any location and create an independent, wireless communications network. This event is open to the public and all are encouraged to attend.

Field Day is a showcase for how Amateur Radio works reliably under any conditions from almost any location in the world to create an independent communications network.
