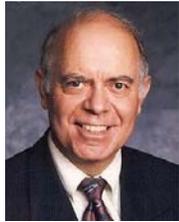

Miscellaneous Radio

Who Is Alan S. Hart?

(And why are we driving on his freeway?)

It's been a slow radio month, T32MI has been active and easily workable on both CW and SSB from Kiribati, but there's not much other fodder for the column. Consequently, we'll turn to a little local geography trivia and maybe cram a little radio in at the end.

It's easy to miss some of the smaller signs along the Interstate but I'll bet at least some of you have noticed that I-80 is the "Alan S. Hart Freeway." Eastbound, the marking sign is at the Auburn Blvd/Riverside overcrossing, and westbound, it is just west of the state line at Nevada [which my Nevada granddaughter reminds every one, is pronounced "Neh-vaaa-dah," and definitely NOT "Neh-vah-dah"].

The original transcontinental highway was the Lincoln Highway although the term "highway" was probably a stretch ... "road" would have been closer. It traversed through Auburn on Lincoln Way [you're surprised?], and you can even find some of the original pavement if you drive east from Loomis on Taylor Rd. At English Colony Road, there will be a marker, and just a bit down ECR, which was part of it, you will be driving on patches of mainly original pavement from about 1915. It originally ran almost 3,400 miles from Lincoln Park in San Francisco to Times Square in NYC. Most historical accounts of it start in NYC and come west, but we're Westerners so we start in SF.

That was it for awhile, until US40 came along in the 20's. You can drive on it's original pavement too, it's the concrete pavement on Taylor Road east of Penryn [look for the Valencia Club, the neon olive in the martini glass on its art deco sign has been inoperative for decades]. In California, it pretty much replaced the Lincoln Highway, there not being all that many ways to surmount the summit of the Sierra Nevada. It too ran right through Auburn, again on Lincoln Way, and there are a number of commemorative markers along the way.

I-80 supplanted US40 in the mid 50's. There is a [possibly urban legend] story that the section from SF to Tahoe was built on the schedule it was to provide an easy path for folks to get to the 1960 Winter Olympics at Squaw Valley 50 years ago. Unlike the Lincoln Highway and US40, I-80 does not end in NYC, it ends in Teaneck NJ. While working at Bell Labs at Murry Hill, I drove over there just to say I've been at each end of the second longest interstate highway in the US. Either I-10 or I-90 is the longest, I'm not sure. The western end is a bit of a letdown, it is where I-80 meets US101 in the City – no sign or marker. I've also been to both ends of US50 – West Sacramento and

Ocean City MD. In West Sac, just after I-80 exits to go over the north end of town, there's a sign with the mileage to Ocean City, something like 3,059 or so. I don't remember a similar sign at the east end.

So how did I-80 in California become Alan's highway? Alan was born in 1907, graduated in Civil Engineering from UC Berkeley, and worked for his entire career at Caltrans. He retired in 1974 and died 20 years later. According to Caltrans, he headed several field divisions over the years, and was primarily in charge of the section of I-80 from SF to the NV state line. He was also instrumental in the design of I-280 in the Bay Area which is noted and has won awards for how well it fits into the rolling hills landscape. I-280 is named after Fr. Junipero Serra, and I-80 from the Placer County line to the Nevada State line is Alan's. I don't know who got the part from SF to Placer County.

And to get just a little radio in, I was recently asked if maritime CW was really CW or MCW ... a keyed carrier that was AM modulated with a tone. The answer is both, but mainly MCW, especially at the coastal stations [the power ripple on the ships gave most of them a sometimes raucous note by themselves]. The reason might surprise you. Most all ship and some shore operating positions at the time included an emergency receiver which was a crystal set [didn't require any power]. You can see an example in the photo of an RCA 4U shipboard console at radiomarine.org/4U-8.html – the crystal set is to the right of the main receiver and a close-up is in the second photo. The little arm sticking out holds the “catwhisker” that was planted on a “sweet spot” on the crystal of galena. Without a BFO, a crystal receiver would be silent unless there was some form of modulation on the signal. It is surprising but this stuff was still on the air and being used into the late 60's and early 70's.

We've had a steady stream of sunspots, it looks like Cycle 24 is really going to happen ... finally.
